## Expanding Services at Scripps Mercy Hospital

Thanks to the generosity of attendees at the April 2024 Scripps Mercy Ball and other community donations, the hospital is expanding its head and neck program, including treatment of head and neck cancers. Central to this effort is the recruitment of two new surgeons, Perry Mansfield, MD, an expert in otolaryngology, head and neck surgery and skull base surgery, and Ravi Garg, MD, a highly skilled plastic surgeon specializing in cranio/maxillofacial and head and neck microvascular surgery.

In response to the increasing demand for comprehensive cardiovascular care in the South Bay, Scripps Mercy Hospital, Chula Vista, is adding a state-of-the-art catheterization lab. The cath lab, which opens in 2026, will feature state-of-the-art equipment and will be able to treat more patients with complex cardiovascular conditions on site. This initiative underscores the commitment of Scripps Mercy Hospital, Chula Vista, to innovative and equitable cardiac care for the growing and diverse community it serves.
